As the climate and extinction crises are deepening, many of us are experiencing a corresponding increase in ecological anxiety and grief. This discussion will explore ways we can stay connected to each other and love the world more deeply, even as we struggle with a sense of loss.

Jason M. Brown was born and raised in Southern California and studied anthropology and international development as an undergraduate at Brigham Young University. He has lived in Vancouver, BC since 2013 and became a Canadian citizen in 2024. He earned joint master's degrees in forestry and theology from Yale. He completed his PhD in 2017 from the Institute for Resources, Environment and Sustainability (IRES) at the University of British Columbia. As a Lecturer at Simon Fraser University Jason teaches courses in religious studies and ecological humanities for the department of Global Humanities. In 2023, he started an ecological chaplaincy program at Simon Fraser University which seeks to bring contemplative practice to climate anxiety and grief.

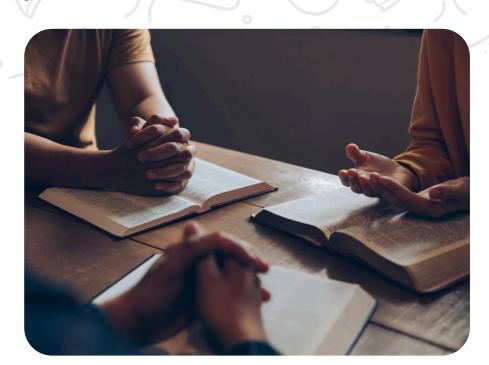

In this retreat series, we will explore the teachings and themes from Cynthia Bourgeault's book "The Meaning of Mary Magdalene: Discovering the Woman at the Heart of Christianity." Each retreat session will focus on one of the three parts from her book blending a time of teaching, embodied practice, interactive reflection—encouraging you to bring your own questions, intuitions, and self-concept models into creative encounter with Mary Magdalene's legacy—and time for sharing what arises.

Heather Ruce facilitates Wisdom practice circles, groups, retreats, and schools. This monthly sung service of Evening Prayer, based on the order found in the Canadian Book of Common Prayer (1962), Evensong is a peaceful and meditative church service in the Anglican tradition. It is rooted in the monastic tradition and invites worshippers to reflect and find spiritual stillness through the beauty of words and choral music.



Fr. Matt Koovisk is currently the Rector of St. John's, Sardis. Growing up as a boy chorister at Christ Church Cathedral in Fredericton, New Brunswick, he was introduced to Evensong at an early age, and his love of Evensong (and choral music in general) has stuck with him ever since. Since those formative years, he's participated in all sorts of church music, most notably as the pianist to Devotion in Motion, a youth choir of St. Michael's Cathedral in Kelowna and St. Mary's Church, Richmond. Matt is currently a member of the tenor section of Belle Voci, a chamber choir in the Fraser Valley.

Zach Power has been singing in choral evensong services since 2015. He studied the traditions at Christ Church Cathedral in Victoria and is keen to bring that aspect of Anglican tradition to light in Chilliwack. Zach has extensive singing and directing experience as an alumnus of the Canadian National Youth Choir and as a past director of the Northern Lights Chamber Choir (Salmon Arm), Shuswap Youth Choir, and Victoria Arion Male Choir.

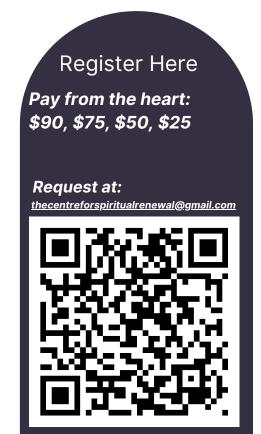


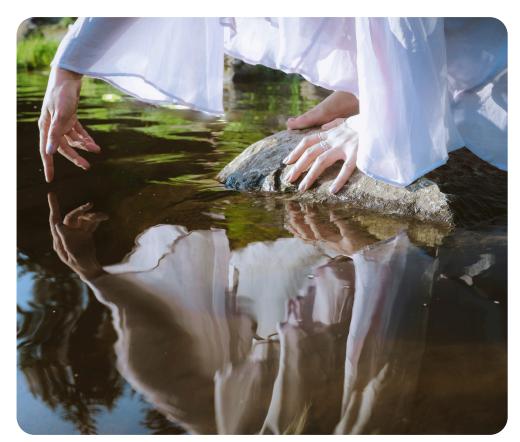
Retreat Day Grace in Grief
