We hope within the humble little pages of this booklet you'll find answers, questions, and wisdom about the journey the Centre has been on and where we have landed too.

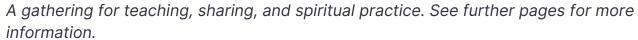

This monthly sung service of Evening Prayer, based on the order found in the Canadian Book of Common Prayer (1962), Evensong is a peaceful and meditative church service in the Anglican tradition. It is rooted in the monastic tradition and invites worshippers to reflect and find spiritual stillness through the beauty of words and choral music.



Fr. Matt Koovisk is currently the Rector of St. John's, Sardis. Growing up as a boy chorister at Christ Church Cathedral in Fredericton, New Brunswick, he was introduced to Evensong at an early age, and his love of Evensong (and choral music in general) has stuck with him ever since. Since those formative years, he's participated in all sorts of church music, most notably as the pianist to Devotion in Motion, a youth choir of St. Michael's Cathedral in Kelowna and St. Mary's Church, Richmond. Matt is currently a member of the tenor section of Belle Voci, a chamber choir in the Fraser Valley.

**Zach Power** has been singing in choral evensong services since 2015. He studied the traditions at Christ Church Cathedral in Victoria and is keen to bring that aspect of Anglican tradition to light in Chilliwack. Zach has extensive singing and directing experience as an alumnus of the Canadian National Youth Choir and as a past director of the Northern Lights Chamber Choir (Salmon Arm), Shuswap Youth Choir, and Victoria Arion Male Choir.

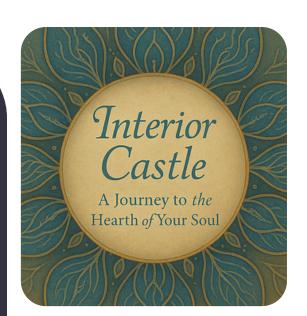

We begin with the words, we move into pondering the text, we grasp words and phrases as seeds of prayer, we watch for longings and prayers that bubble to the surface. And then, we sink into to cool stream of silence that immerses us in the Divine. Silence. Beyond words, but not without them.

10:00am - 12:00pm Online - Zoom Registration to come

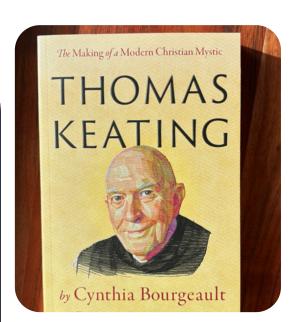

Cynthia will explore the implications of Keating's directive to meet the world guided by the truth of silence and science, and filled with creativity and compassion.

She will consider the invitation to step outside of religious and political boundaries; and what it might mean that we choose to leave ourselves open to the "inspiration from the heart of God." We will build on the evolution of Thomas Keating's thought, and take a further step into the application of his "last words" to the world in which we live. Cynthia will address the necessary and painful kinds of maturation which the contemplative community needs to undergo in order to hold a collective Wisdom presence for the fracturing world in which we live.

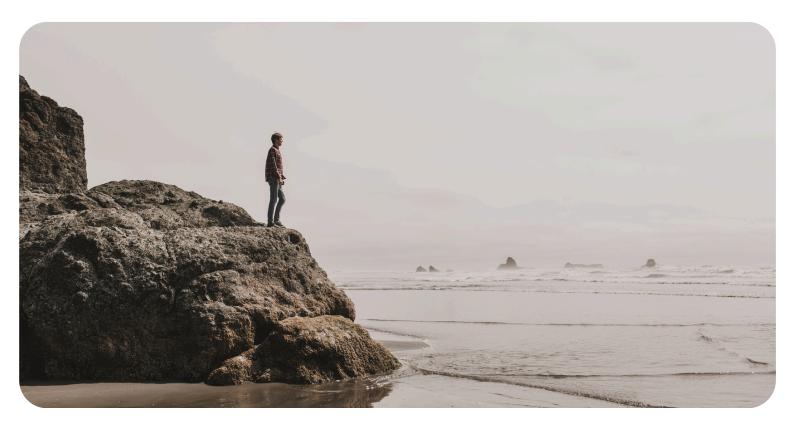

# a Mystic

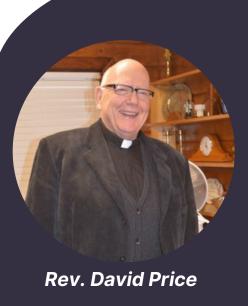

Group study on Carl McColman's Read the Bible like a Mystic: Contemplative Wisdom and the Word (2025).

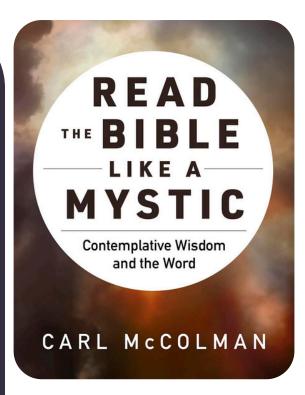

# Nurturing a deepening awareness of God



The CENTRE FOR SPIRITUAL RENEWAL extends a warm invitation to gather in person or online for life-giving opportunities to connect and deepen in relationship with God, oneself, and others.

The Centre offers retreats, study, prayer, and practice groups, workshops, conferences, and spiritual direction.

The Centre is about supporting people on their spiritual journey using a variety of spiritual traditions to experience God's love, wisdom, and healing; that we may be a loving engaged presence in community and for the world.

#### What is The Centre for Spiritual Renewal?

The Centre for Spiritual Renewal is a Christian Formation coalition that began in 2018 at the Anglican Parish of St. Dunstan, Aldergrove, and has now expanded to include St Andrew's Langley, St. Thomas, Chilliwack, St. Paul's, Vancouver, and All Saints, Mission.

The Centre's development was assisted by the Diocese of New Westminster (DONW) Parish Development School and continues to be supported by Parish Development grants as its scope expands. In 2022, the Centre focus broadened to include spiritual formation gatherings for children, youth and families. The Diocese further encouraged the Centre ministry in 2025 by supporting an Inter-parish Co-ordinator and a Communications facilitator to assist parishes in the DONW who want to establish a Centre with their congregation. This initiative is to offer clergy and congregations resources and support to grow this ministry without it being a burden. Each parish has its own distinct Centre and can be connected to the Inter-parish ministry and program.

#### What does The Centre do?

At the Centre, we have a strong desire to grow in God's grace, to be a place where people come to encounter God's loving presence, and to experience an authentic faith community. We invite all to gather, learn, pray, and practice in ways that are meaningful to each person.



# Integration & Transformation

#### **How does The Centre work?**

Parishes offer weekly, monthly, and occasional events that are either 'Dropin' or require registration with a suggested fee. Scholarships are provided so all may come. A warm invitation is given to all.

#### Who is involved in The Centre?

Trained leaders and specialized facilitators from a variety of walks of life offer a broad spectrum of spiritual practices, studies, and workshops. We highly value local leadership and at times the Centre hosts an event with a high-profile facilitator to encourage our learning and practice. The Centre has a group of advisors who meet regularly to listen together and share from their experience, skill-sets, and wisdom. This has proven to be a very valuable encouragement to the directors of the Centre. The Advisor Team is: Archbishop John Stephens, Rev. Tellison Glover, Rev. Jessica Schapp, Rev. David Taylor, Rev. Dixie Black, Rev. Anne Crosthwait, and the parish priests: Rev. Andrew Halladay, Rev. Paul Bowie, Rev. Clarence Li, and Rev. Lorie Martin.

'Integration & Transformation' are two key words that mark the life and flow of the Centre. Participants are experiencing spiritual vibrancy and a sustaining connection to God which affects all areas of life, faith and family. We have noticed that those who join Centre gatherings from outside the church are drawn in and some return to parish life. Those within a parish are curious, inspired, and drawn to return to practices from their Anglican roots. There is a weaving together of lives integrating into the parish's community life, spiritual growth and renewal to love and serve the world.

The Intention of the Centre team and gatherings is reflected in the focus to invite participants to compassionately **listen** to Spirit, self, and others; to **engage** in an open and authentic manner, and to **rest** in the transforming "Presence & Action" of God.



# Spiritual Direction

**Spiritual direction** or spiritual companionship is an ongoing relationship in which a person desirous of being attentive to their spiritual journey regularly meets with a spiritual director/companion (usually once a month) for the purpose of becoming more attuned to the presence of God's spirit in all of life. It is a listening time to explore what matters to us: our joys, struggles, hurts, hopes, fears, and dreams. It is a time to consider our relationship with God, ourselves, and others and discover and drink from the Living Water of the Indwelling Spirit.

The inter-parish team of spiritual companions are available for occassional or ongoing one-on-one sessions to accompany you as you grow in grace. The Centre has a Peer Supervision Group for directors wanting support, learning, and connection.
